PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This is one topic I wish I didn't have to write about. With the onset of summer and the rising reports of sexual predators preying on our children, we must develop ways to keep them safe from harm. To assist us with this, we have invited Detective Sgt. Wilson of the Loves Park Police, our alderman Carl Wasco and Liz Hughes our Community Service Officer to attend our meeting on Tuesday. IT IS VITALLY IMPORTANT THAT ALL PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS, OR THOSE INVOLVED IN CHILD CARE ATTEND. We have ordered an extra capacity room for this. PLEASE, PLEASE do not think that it couldn't happen to your family. It can and it does. Last summer a neighborhood child was stalked by a predator. This year other issues have arisen. With the clear-cutting of trees on Spring Brook Road, the swimming pond is now visible to all who pass leaving our children vulnerable.

We spent a delightful two weeks in Georgia visiting the grandkids, but returning to the clear-cutting on Spring Brook was disheartening. It looked like a tornado or microburst hit the area! I received no prior notification from the city regarding this. I have met with the city and with our landscaping people to discuss what can be done. In the interim I have hired EBR Lawn Care to install privacy slats in the fence until a permanent solution can be reached. A meeting is to be scheduled with all concerned.

Another issue is garage sales. Residents, please note only two garage sales are allowed per year. This is not an association rule, it is a city ordinance. The only exception is the annual sale where the entire subdivision is encouraged to participate. This is considered a sponsored event. Those found to be violating the ordinance will be reported to the city and cited.

This year marks the new building committee with Tom McNeeny (chairman), Richard Gassmann and Carl Walthall. All plans for fences, sheds and additions must be submitted to the committee for approval prior to construction.

On a sad note, the association lost a good friend and lake champion, Dave Johnson. Due to Dave's efforts, David Lynch chose making our boat dock handicap accessible as his Eagle Scout project. In addition, Dave was a true friend and sportsman who started many on the road to fishing. He will be missed.

On a personal note...this is my last year as President of the Association. Through the efforts of many fine people was have turned around a system that let dues and assessments slide to one of proactive collections. To a Board in which many residents felt they had no voice to one that actively seeks input from all. Carol and I want to enjoy some extended time away and I think it is time for new blood and fresh ideas. So for all of those who have said "If I were President".....here's your chance!

Thank you to all who have helped us through these four years. It was and is an experience that I will not soon forget nor will I ever want to. I'm not done yet, tho. There are still several things I would like to accomplish such as amending the by-laws to reflect ONE class of residents instead of the "A" and "B" classes, and Carol is working on publishing a new directory this year.

Remember – don't neglect your dues. Payment plans are available for those who need help. Summer is coming (trust me, I saw it on the calendar!) WATCH FOR CHILDREN!!!

Backyard Wildlife: Black Squirrels

One of the things I love most about the Spring Lakes neighborhoods is all the wildlife here. In the past two years since my family moved in, we've seen the f following animals in our backyard: turkeys, raccoons, ducks, foxes, coyotes, countless songbirds,

opossums, mallard woodpeckers, hawks, and of course, squirrels. There are two kinds of squirrels common to our area - the larger fox squirrels and the smaller grey squirrels. But you have probably also noticed a third type of squirrel in the neighborhood - dark brown or black squirrels. These dark squirrels are actually grey squirrels. They have an abundance of dark pigment (melanin) in their fur - a condition known as "melanism". This is a genetic trait. The exact way that this trait is inherited in squirrels is unknown. Populations of black squirrels are native to the U.S. and were here when the first Europeans arrived. They are more common in the eastern and northern states and are extremely common in many parts of southern Canada. Populations of black squirrels have also been introduced into other areas where they are nonnative, including western states and parts of the UK. In many towns and cities, local populations of black squirrels are viewed with pride and are promoted as tourist attractions. There are even several college campuses that have adopted the black squirrel as an official or unofficial mascot, including Kent State and Harvard. In Rockford, there are a few isolated pockets of black squirrels, including a population in Aldeen park and our neighborhood bunch. Some folks believe that these black squirrels are more aggressive than their grey counterparts and will drive the "normal" squirrels away. Currently there are no reliable data to support this. In fact, based on what we've seen in our yard, which is full of feeders which at times are visited by as many as eight squirrels at once, the black squirrels are chased away just as often as they are the chasers. Some evidence suggests that black squirrels survive better in urban areas where there are fewer predators, since their dark color may cause them to be more easily spotted when they are out in the open. In any event, Spring Lakes Estates is lucky to have its own population of these unusual squirrels. I hope you enjoy them as much as my family and I

always, be sure your children are properly supervised.

almost constant use. Also, please make sure that the picnic area is picked up and cleaned of refuse after your party. If the refuse can is filled, please do not leave your bags on the ground next to them. (This only encourages the wildlife in the area to have their own party! Only they don't clean up after themselves!) Bring your bags with you and dispose of them at home. As always, the swimming area will always be available to residents regardless of any ongoing parties.

Pets are not permitted in the pond and beach area. Loose animals found in this area will be removed by Rockford animal control.

Make sure you have your activity pass with you at the pond. The passes will be delivered shortly.

DIRECTORIES

We're doing it again. The association directories will be updated this summer. To ensure that the listings are correct, I am asking the block chairs to contact everyone in their areas for verification of information. If you wish your phone unlisted, please let your block chair know.

LAKE

FISHING: A fishing license is required to fish in the lake. You can keep what you catch if it falls within the limits of the guideline:

- 3 bass per day, catch & release only
- 3 catfish per day, 14 inches or longer
- 3 walleye per day, 14 inches or longer unlimited panfish (bluegill, sunfish, etc.)

Except for the boat dock pier, pond and Weymouth Park, the area surrounding the lake is private property. This includes the berm/dam behind the duplexes and condos. Fish in the designated areas ONLY (the boat dock pier or from your boat).

BOATING: Your boats must carry a current boat registration number issued by the state. Please notify the Association president of this number.

SWIMMING: Swimming is not allowed in the lake. The lake is not treated to maintain sanitary or safety conditions and is occasionally treated for

algae and other weed control.


