PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I had hoped to make this letter a fun one full of insights from our trip to the Grand Canyon with our granddaughters and our trip to Eagle River. But I find myself trying to control my anger and frustration over events that have occurred this summer and, especially, in the past few days.

There have been numerous reports of young people being in Weymouth Park after dark and sometimes well into the wee hours of the morning drinking, using drugs, using the park as a tryst, and vandalizing. The refuse of these activities are found strewn about the park the next day. Not a pretty sight for the children playing there. The latest act of vandalism occurred a week ago Thursday night. The playground equipment at Weymouth Park was spray painted with vulgar and obscene language. This was repeated again a few days later on the same equipment. THIS HAS GOT TO STOP! In addition to this, vehicles have been broken into, park property vandalized and other unacceptable behaviors.

For the past four years, the Board and I have strived to maintain a neighborhood where it is peaceful, nice, and friendly. I will not, under any circumstances, tolerate any further acts of this kind. THE PARKS CLOSE AT DUSK! Unless you have a special permit obtained from a board member, ANYONE CAUGHT IN THE PARK THAT IS NOT THERE ON ASSOCIATION BUSINESS OR BY PERMISSION, WILL BE CHARGED WITH TRESPASS AND THEIR ACTIVITY PASS REVOKED. If you have guests, you are responsible for their actions.

I regret having to resort to this, but the Association has spent time and money cleaning up after these people and it is not fair to those whose homes border the park to be subjected to behavior of this type.

All of the willow trees on association property are being removed if they show signs of decay or disease. We had a very large willow collapse in Weymouth Park by the playground at five o'clock on a sunny afternoon with children playing in the park. Subsequent investigation showed that it had rotted from the inside out and could not support its weight.

The decision to remove the willow trees was taken for two reasons. First and foremost, the safety of children and parents is paramount, and second from a liability aspect. A court in northern Mass. found a homeowner's association liable to the tune of 1.2 million dollars when a tree fell in the common area and slightly grazed a resident. The court held that the association should have monitored the trees, especially those with known defects, for signs of faults.

Replacement trees have been ordered from D.S. Enterprises available from a special purchase. These trees are 12 - 14 foot white pines and blue spruce.

DUES: All those with outstanding dues for 2009 and have not entered into a payment plan, will be turned over to our legal counsel for collections. I have afforded everyone multiple opportunities to pay and/or get on a payment plan and yet many residents have ignored these opportunities. We will be proceeding directly to small claims court where you will be responsible for the dues plus all accrued interest, court costs, and legal fees. A judgement will be entered against you and will affect your credit.

As many of you know, I had announced that this would be my last year as president of the association. This was met with both cheer and dismay. I haven't yet completed everything I wanted to accomplish, so I have decided to stay on for one more year, but with a difference. This will be a copresidency. Board member Amy Wateska has expressed interest in the presidency and will serve as co-president next year. The responsibilities will be broken down as follows: I will continue to handle the dues enforcement and ongoing legal issues while Amy will be in charge of meetings and day-to-day operations. This will afford her experience for when I do step down in 2011. I trust this arrangement will meet with your approval.

Pam Long, our recording secretary for the last two years, has resigned. I am saddened at her departure, but we wish her all the best. Amy will fill in as recording secretary until a replacement can be found. I was gratified at the response for volunteers when we re-started the pond, luminary, garage sale, and block chair programs. We now put out the call for another volunteer, that of Recording Secretary. We need this person as soon as possible. Please call me at the number below to volunteer.

LAKE, POND AND PARKS

LAKE: The summer saw a change in our care of the lake. First, we replaced the 18 year-old aerator system with new aerator/bubbler system that "turns over" the lake twice and fast and keeps the water moving and is much more energy efficient. Second, we changed from McCloud Services to Aqualine Weed Technologies. As with all new contractors, there were a few bumps in the road. It took awhile to hit a a winning combination of chemical to control weed and algae. Some of the algae did clog the aerators but have been or are being repaired. Also, next week we are meeting with a company that uses vacuum technology to dredge lakes This can be done in stages and is less expensive and invasive than massive dredging. Stay tuned for updates.

POND: The pond will be closing for the season on Monday, September 14. Thanks to Pond Chair, Paula & Dave Reiter, for another great year.




